Stones and crystals have held powerful meanings through the ages. David Morris's latest collection, Fortuna (named after the Roman goddess of fortune), is based on coloured gemstones with different properties: blue agate for positivity; pink opal to promote inner peace and calm; and green chrysoprase to bring love, joy and contentment. Finally, there is mother-of-pearl to reflect protection, harmony and the healing power of the sea.
